I attended an all-day strategic planning workshop through the Civic Leadership Academy at NIU. Strategic planning will be a focal point this year so this was a helpful refresher. It is likely our community survey will be concluded by the end of May. The results would then be presented to the Board at the June meeting. This will put us into July for our strategic planning retreat. We can discuss more specific possible dates at the Board meeting.

We are planning the Library's strategy at the Woodridge Town Meeting on April 12th. In addition to a large tabletop display, we're going to bring an umbrella with the library logo. We are going to start circulating umbrellas and this will help publicize the fact, as well as being a good marketing tool and visual prop. The idea behind this is that if you're at the library and it starts raining, you can check out an umbrella to protect yourself and any items you are checking out., as well as promoting the library while you're using it.
