Library Director's Report January 2019

We have just launched a new product I am very excited about called My Library Rewards. It's an incentive program that works much the same way a store loyalty program does. You earn points for every item you check out, and can redeem those points for free and discounted items at local businesses. Each item you check out earns ten points. You can register and redeem points either at the My Library Rewards web site or by using their app. Some libraries currently participating include Fountaindale, Plainfield, and Lemont.

There are many aspects of this program I like; it's a great partnership with local businesses, it gives patrons a way to save money with their library card, in a more overt and different way than they do now, and it is so similar to existing loyalty programs that it will be easy for patrons to understand. We have currently started a soft launch of this program. Receipts telling patrons how many points they have earned, and encouraging them to sign up for the program, are printing at the circulation desk. This lets us work any kinks out, and get used to questions, without the large scale of a promotional campaign. We will do the official hard launch starting March 4th. This will include web site, newsletter, etc.

The Live and Learn Construction Grant webinar has been set for March 14^{th} from 9:30 AM – 3:30 PM. This is when the grant committee will review all applications and ask any questions they have for the libraries who have submitted applications. I will be attending; it will be interesting to hear how many other applications there are and what they involve. With the six hour timeframe, they are either extremely thorough, or there are many applicants.
