All of the actions to date regarding the relocation of the Village Hall are quite puzzling! It is difficult to see the reasoning of the Trusteees in the matter. It is as though they are being driven by a maddening compulsion to complete something (anything) before the April elections.

Just a year ago, after a "study," this same group of men declined to purchase the Winston-Hills sales office as a Village Hall. Apparently, their conclusions were that \$40,000 was too much to spend on a temporary structure, and the location was not readily accessible.

Now they have suddenly found that \$100,000 is not too much for the remodeling of a barn, and have selected one of the least accessible sites in the village.

As a site for the public works building, there could not have been a less intelligent location selected! Consider the waste of tax dollars in sending snow removal equipment from the extreme south end of the village to the northernmost areas. All maintenance will be double travel time and cost for the north half of Woodridge.

What about all of their other "planning"? If they really were going to acquire the sewer company, wouldn't it make sense to put the public works barn on route 53? And as we are so near the time for development of Woodridge Center, isn't it possible that they could have made some arrangements with the owners for the land that is to be used for municipal facilities?

We seriously question their pledge to "keep faith with the residents." Is it in the best interest of Woodridge to desecrate this lovely park site? Is it fair to the School District to deny them use of this land, and then erect a monstrous barn in a purely single family area?

Why was each of the "progress reports" out of sequence? How is it that we were led to believe that the remodeling costs in the barn for the Village Hall portion would be near \$50,000, when -the bids ranged from near \$80,000 to over \$90,000? Is this an example of their planning? Or is it something more insidious?

Shortly before the election, the administration will have something to point to as testimony of their two years in office. We can expect an "open house" at our fine new remodeled \$100,000 BARN!
