Trustee's Report



At the Village Board meeting of February 3, 1972, the Mayor, with the unanimous approval of the trustees, appointed Mr. Richard Watson, of 6109 Tyler Drive to fill the position vacated by Mr. Robert Mayer, who was transferred to Quincy, Ill.

Dick and his wife Ellen have four children - Jane, Dick, Cathie, and Kenny.

Trustee Watson, who received his undergraduate degree and a Masters Degree in Market Research and Planning from Loyola University in Chicage, was appointed initially to the Village Plan Gomission in August, 1971, and was elected Secretary of that body in September, 1971.

Dick Watson is currently employed by Blue Cross/Blue Shield in Chicage as Manager of Market Research, and was instrumental in obtaining a HUD grant in the amount of \$100,000. The City of Chicago intends to implement a study to determine "The Needs and Financing of Health Care in the Model Cities Neighborhoods of Chicago."

'76 Study

The Plan Commission of the Village of Woodridge recently completed a mailing to all of the residents consisting of two questionnaires (one for the male and one for the female of the house) designed to help the Commission formulate and evaluate information necessary to complete the "76" plan study.

A total of 3170 houses received the mailers, and as of Feb. 1, 817 responses have been returned.

The purpose of the mailing is basically to match demographic data collected at this point in time to that obtained from the 1970 census so as to aid future developers and the Village Board, to accurately ascertain the population, spending habits, consumer likes and dislikes, etc...

Sewer & Water

As you probably know, the Village Administration recently consummated an agreement with the Woodridge Sewer and Water Company to purchase the entire system, both water distribution, and sewerage transmission and treatment facility. Subsequently, the Village sold the treatment plant to DuPage County. The county will operate and expand this facility. It will meet the growth requirements of the area without any major expenditure of Village funds, and it will allow the county to embark on the Treatment Plant Regionalization Plan as advanced by the Environmental Protection Agency and the Illinois Pollution Control Board. In addition, federal funds are available for these required expansions only if achieved under county supervision, not village supervision.

The operation of the Sewer and Water System has been a relatively smooth operation, although some problems have been encountered, as can well be expected with the "takeover" of any new business.
