Library Director's Report February 2021

The Children's Department has created a new interactive program called Building Blocks for Tots that promotes school readiness for children ages 3 through 5. It's designed to enhance cognitive, social, and emotional development and supports growth in areas such as language, literacy, and social and emotional development. Each week's participants will get learning packets as well as a link to a video created by the children's staff. Each video has links to online songs or activities. Every week, participants can pick up a new Building Blocks packet in the Children's Department and choose a book off the Building Blocks for Tots weekly book cart or ask for curbside pickup.

This summer we are planning multiple story walks, both at the library and at multiple park district locations. We started story walks last summer and they have proven to be quite popular. They are also ideally suited to the current social distancing guidelines and recommendations. Because we do not want to create crowds, we are focusing on virtual programs and interactive, self-paced outside activities such as story walks. As circumstances can change quickly, we will keep assessing and be ready to adapt rapidly if necessary.

We recently finished our 1,000th book bundle, and handled it with appropriate fanfare, including an impromptu gift bag with some fun prizes and activities.

Our Annual Library Certification with the Illinois State Library has been completed, ensuring we are in good standing with the state and eligible for all relevant grant opportunities.
