Library Director's Report March/April 2020

As we rapidly change our service model to adapt to the COVID-19 public health crisis, it's interesting to see how use of library resources has shifted. Use of our ebooks and streaming audio and video have skyrocketed. ERead Illinois, which includes ebooks and audiobooks, has had a 73% increase in number of users, and a 90% increase in checkouts. Hoopla, which is ebooks, audiobooks, streaming music and video, has had an 85% increase in number of users and a 111% increase in checkouts. Media on Demand, which is ebooks and audiobooks, has had a 23% increase in number of users and a 51% increase in checkouts. Our new service, Kanopy, which is streaming video, already has checkouts higher then both ERead Illinois and Hoopla. What I find most interesting is the increase in number of users, which means we are getting a large number of people who have never used these services before. Also of interest is the difference in the increases. Media on Demand has always been our most popular e-content service, The pattern of increases suggests people are interested in branching out and exploring our other services.
