Library Operations

Circulation for the month of January was 51,468, down 7% from January, 2013. (Lower circulation figures partially a result of dangerously cold and snowy conditions and program cancellations in Children's.) Registered borrowers number 22,334 which is 67.7% of the jurisdictional population. People/Door Count for the month: 35,881 (versus 37,386 last January)
