Library Administrator's Report April, 2015

The biggest event of the month (or of the year so far, of course) was the Go Live! of the new SWAN Catalog system software on April 14. No software roll-out is without its glitches, and this was no exception. The dedicated SWAN staff, staff at the vendor's home offices, and our own staff deserve many kudos for responding to and reporting issues. Some patrons were more patient than others in dealing with the glitches. I am including a page from a presentation on the migration given by the SWAN Director, which has an interesting comparison of the sheer size of SWAN with other large consortiums. Because all SWAN sites (unique libraries, in our case) are independent entities without one central cataloging standard, there is a great variation in how materials get catalogued. This was part of the transition problem. While many of the problems have been resolved, there is on-going training that will need to take place with some libraries.

Re-Discover programming continued in April. Not as many Adult programs for this multi-library event were scheduled for April as in the past due to our planned renovation. The Children's Department opted out of Re-Discover altogether this year due to renovation and past low turnout numbers.

During National Library Week, we asked patrons to send in "shelfies": photographic images with or without faces of favorite book shelves, in or out of the library. Fifty-three people from around Woodridge responded.
