The Library transformed into a penguin and snowflake filled wonderland for the 2nd annual Winterfest, a collaboration with the Village and Park District taking place in Town Centre. The Library Staff (22) hosted crafts, interactive picture stations (igloo, snow globe), Ana & Elsa meet & greet, wheel of fortune, games, and a movie inside the library for over 1700 visitors and our giant outdoor Frosty was a popular photo stop.
