Library Director's Report March 2025

Volatile spring weather didn't dampen patron enthusiasm for Shamrock Slime (107), Better Sleep Now (36), and Oldies music (57). Children's services had "big days," such as March 21 with Littlest Musicians (96) for young children and a trendy craft, Charm it Up, (73) for older tweens. WPL's annual tradition of hosting an Irish dancing celebration (200) in the lobby caught the attention of the *Patch* online newspaper, who ran our event as their lead story for three days straight. The Circulation Staff gave away nearly **1500 free activities** that patrons took home to complete, including kits for babies, learning worksheets for toddlers, puzzle packs for adults, and many, many craft kits!

Behind the scenes, staff made progress on summer reading plans, the yearly external audit, and interviewing candidates to fill open positions. A productive Strategic Planning retreat brought together the Board and Staff to discuss the results of a recent Public Survey, WPL's strengths and opportunities. WPL reacted with advocacy, and will continue to uphold that public libraries are valuable, and strong libraries and library systems are critical to communities and individuals, in response to concerned residents and library-supporters.
