Library Director's Report May 2022

Our Summer Reading Program began on May 26th and in just its first two weeks has already been highly successful. For the first time in two years, library staff have been able to go into the schools to promote summer reading which we can see has made a significant difference. Staff did a total of 47 summer reading presentations at the schools, which was a feat of both logistics and endurance. We are seeing the results in our participation. At the end of our first day of summer reading we already had 180 children signed up and 90 adults. Currently we stand at 943 children, 123 teens and 98 adults signed up for summer reading. Many of the families that have come in to sign up said they came in because someone from the library came to their school and got them interested in the program. We are also seeing more new library card sign ups from people coming in for summer reading. The children's department also did a short and entertaining promotional video for summer reading which has already received 286 views. We are also partnering with the Park District this summer and our first Storytime in the Park had 58 participants, despite rather inclement weather.
