Library Director's Report July 2025

Patrons are raving about 2025 mystery-themed summer programs including the Murder Mystery Masquerade (94) held July 19 from 6 to 9 p.m., our first after-hours program for adults. Teen Summer Reading registration (290) and engagement (145) doubled last year's statistics, clearly due to a trendy prize revamp and new reading log based program, planned by Children's Services and hosted by the Adult & Teen department. Summer storytimes (359), Royal Balls (96), Little Chefs (200) and a Bad Guys (350) finale to the Summer Reading season attracted a wide-range of patrons.

Collaboration across the Library and across the Village is playing an essential role in programming. Ten free and confidential meetings took place during new monthly *Social Worker in the Library Hours*, the local food pantry held free ACT tutoring, and *Stories in the Park* (97) was popular. A Trunk or Treat event to be held in partnership with the Village has been planned and all-Village planning for a November Winterfest continues. Circulation staff were busy with increased checkouts while the Tech Services team actively processed new materials.

Staff celebrated Jessica Smith, recipient of the prestigious 2025 Illinois Library Association's Youth Librarian of the Year Award. Jessica says that the award is the result of tremendous team efforts by Children's staff and each colleague in the Library who supports her creative and outside-the-box ideas. Support and encouragement from patrons, volunteers, and Board Members contributes to the Library's ability to offer impactful programs and services. Residents and Library patrons can take pride in Jessica's award: their local public library is out of the ordinary and simply excellent.
