From the Director



The impact of the tornado that struck Woodridge this past summer is still being felt. Once the immediate emergency was over and the cleanup and rebuilding began, those who suffered property damage started the time consuming and often frustrating process of filing an insurance claim. One of the lessons we've learned in the aftermath of the tornado was that

people needed practical, common sense information on this topic. Knowing how to choose the appropriate insurance coverage and understanding the ins and outs of filing a claim can make a significant financial difference when disaster strikes.

The Woodridge Public Library and the Village of Woodridge are collaborating to provide a program to help people become better informed about insurance.

Patrice Dziire, the Deputy Director of Consumer Education and Protection at the Illinois Department of Insurance, will present "**Lessons Learned from**

the Tornado: Insurance Coverage Tips and Information" on Wednesday, December 8 at 7 p.m. at the Woodridge Public Library.

In addition to getting valuable information, as well as a chance to ask questions, we will be providing free to all attendees some swag that is both practical and attractive. Everyone will receive a **Life Savers candle** (choose from four Life Savers flavors – cherry, pineapple, watermelon or raspberry). You will also receive a limited edition **LED Flashlight** with the Woodridge Library logo, and a free **Document Holder** with the Village of Woodridge logo. We hope you attend this valuable program.
